Privacy notice for governors, trustees and members

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how the school/TKAT uses any personal data that we hold about them. We comply with this right by providing ‘privacy notices’ (sometimes called ‘fair processing notices’) to individuals where we are processing their personal data.

This privacy notice explains how we collect, store and use personal data about individuals we appoint as governors, trustees or members across the Trust.

We, The Kemnal Academies Trust (TKAT), are the ‘data controller’ for the purposes of data protection law.

Our data protection officer can be contacted (see ‘Contact us’ below).

The personal data we hold

We process data relating to our governors, trustees and members. Personal data that we may collect, use, store and share (when appropriate) about you includes, but is not restricted to:

- Contact details
- Date of birth
- Recruitment information, information included in a CV or cover letter or as part of the application process
- Outcomes of any disciplinary and/or grievance procedures
- Attendance data
- Photographs
- CCTV footage
- Data about your use of the school’s/TKAT’s information and communications systems

Why we use this data

The purpose of processing this data is to help us run the school and/or Trust, including to:

- Promote effective governance within the School/Trust
- Facilitate safe recruitment, as part of our safeguarding obligations towards pupils
- Ensure the safety and welfare of our staff and students



Our lawful basis for using this data

We only collect and use personal information about you when the law allows us to. Most commonly, we use it where we need to:

- Comply with a legal obligation
- Carry out a task in the public interest

Less commonly, we may also use personal information about you where:

- You have given us consent to use it in a certain way

Where you have provided us with consent to use your data, you may withdraw this consent at any time. We will make this clear when requesting your consent, and explain how you go about withdrawing consent if you wish to do so.

Some of the reasons listed above for collecting and using personal information about you overlap, and there may be several grounds which justify the school's/TKAT's use of your data.

Collecting this information

While the majority of information we collect from you is mandatory, there is some information that you can choose whether or not to provide to us.

Whenever we seek to collect information from you, we make it clear whether you must provide this information (and if so, what the possible consequences are of not complying), or whether you have a choice.

How we store this data

We create and maintain a file for each governor/trustee/member. The information contained in this file is kept secure and is only used for purposes directly relevant to your role in the organisation.

Once your period of office with us has ended, we will retain this file and where appropriate delete the information in line with the 5th principle of the GDPR (Storage Limitation).

Data sharing

We do not share information about you with any third party without your consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Where it is legally required, or necessary (and it complies with data protection law) we may share personal information about you with:

- The relevant local authority – to meet our contractual obligations to share certain information with it, such as governor services
- The Department for Education - to meet our legal obligation in providing information about governors/trustees/members
- Our regulator - Ofsted, the organisation that supervises us, under whom we have a legal obligation and a public interest to provide governor/trustee/member information
- Our auditors - to meet our legal obligations to share data in order to ensure compliance to relevant legislation
- Security organisations - to meet our legal obligations to share information where appropriate, such as safeguarding concerns
- Professional advisers and consultants - to meet our public task obligations in providing quality governance across the Trust
- Police forces, courts, tribunals - to meet our legal obligations as a public body.
- Professional bodies such as the NGA - to meet our public task obligations in providing quality governance

Transferring data internationally

Where we transfer personal data to a country or territory outside the European Economic Area, we will do so in accordance with data protection law.

Your rights:

How to access personal information we hold about you

Individuals have a right to make a ‘**subject access request**’ to gain access to personal information that TKAT holds about them.

If you make a subject access request, and if we do hold information about you, we will:

- Give you a description of it
- Tell you why we are holding and processing it, and how long we will keep it for
- Explain where we got it from, if not from you
- Tell you who it has been, or will be, shared with
- Let you know whether any automated decision-making is being applied to the data, and any consequences of this
- Give you a copy of the information in an intelligible form

You may also have the right for your personal information to be transmitted electronically to another organisation in certain circumstances.

Your other rights regarding your data

Under data protection law, individuals have certain rights regarding how their personal data is used and kept safe. You have the right to:

- Object to the use of your personal data if it would cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- Prevent your data being used to send direct marketing
- Object to the use of your personal data for decisions being taken by automated means (by a computer or machine, rather than by a person)
- In certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data corrected, deleted or destroyed, or restrict processing
- Claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the data protection regulations

Complaints

We take any complaints about our collection and use of personal information very seriously.

If you think that our collection or use of personal information is unfair, misleading or inappropriate, or have any other concern about our data processing, please raise this with us in the first instance.
